In *A Rose by Any Name* (Algonquin, \$20), Douglas Brenner and Stephen Scanniello tell the stories behind the monikers of more than 1,200 varieties. After learning about (from near right) Scotland’s ‘Ayrshire Rose’ (brought by a redcoat from America), ‘Mademoiselle de Sombreuil’ (a French anti-royalist who drank the blood of aristocrats), and ‘Mademoiselle Cécile Brunner’ (a Swiss rose farmer’s daughter), you wonder if Shakespeare got it wrong.
